



St. Margaret Mary Evangelization Library

The library was established in 1995 as a response to Pope John Paul, II's call for evangelization.

The purpose of the library is to provide educational material to help adults understand their Catholic faith more fully and to provide them with spiritual reading to enhance their faith. The library also has an extensive collection of videos and audios that are both educational and entertaining.

The library is a resource for both the clergy and the laity.

The collection ranges from the writings of the early church fathers through Thomas Aquinas & Ignatius Loyola. It includes gospel commentaries, treatise on the Virgin Mary, lives of the saints and books on spiritual direction. The library has a few select fiction books.



Saint Margaret Mary Parishioners owe a debt of gratitude to the late Msgr. Richard Carroll for generously providing a dedicated space for the library and Msgr. Lanaux Raeshide for allowing us to keep the space.

This more than any other single reason is why we are one of the very few church parishes to have a separate library facility for the use of adults in the parish.



The library has a state of the art library software program & Internet access which makes it a completely self-service facility. You may check out & return material if none of the staff is available.

A group of dedicated volunteers staff the library.



Library Hours:

The library is open and available for use anytime the Evangelization building is open. The library is seldom locked.

The volunteer librarian is usually present:

Monday - Wednesday morning

Thursday afternoon.
